



## Notes from the GPDID Stakeholder Consultation Breakfast that was hosted by the MEC Ms Nandi Mayathula-Khoza GDID Offices 12 August 2014, 09:00 – 15:00

## Purpose – To share the Department's Five year strategic plan

## Background

- 1. The CSIR has entered into a framework of Cooperation with the Department of Infrastructure in the Gauteng Province (GPDID).
- 2. There were a number of stakeholders in attendance ranging from representatives from other municipalities in Gauteng (City of Johannesburg, City of Tshwane, City of Ekurhuleni as well as Mogale City).
- 3. The HOD, Mr B. Netshiswinzhe took the stakeholders through the draft strategic five year plan. The plan is in relation to the Departments mandate which is to develop and maintain socio economic infrastructure through:
  - 3.1. Ensuring implementation of all infrastructure programmes and projects as captured in the short medium and; long term plans of the Gauteng Provincial Government (GPG)
  - 3.2. Maintain the construction of GPG capital expenditure (CAPEX) projects such as schools, hospitals, clinics and recreation centres
  - 3.3. Managing the provision of maintenance services for all GPG infrastructure
  - 3.4. Managing the provincial property portfolio

3.5. Ensuring the participation of communities through the implementation of the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) within GPG CAPEX projects and other departments projects

- 3.6. Utilising the construction sector as a catalyst for the development of skills, the creation of jobs and the development of sustainable communities
- 4. The GDID has come up with six strategic goals:
  - 4.1. Sustainable infrastructure
  - 4.2. Accelerate service delivery
  - 4.3. Organisational development for building state capacity
  - 4.4. Optimise state assets for economic development and supporting entrepreneurs
  - 4.5. Empowering communities through job creation in partnership with the public and private sector
  - 4.6. Integrated planning and delivery of projects
- 5. The Departmental has proposed eight initiatives to address this:
  - 5.1. The development of a complete Immovable Asset Register
  - 5.2. The implementation of a maintenance turnaround strategy
  - 5.3. The development of smart class rooms designs
  - 5.4. The development of standard health infrastructure designs
  - 5.5. The implementation of IDMS as a turnaround intervention for the Department
  - 5.6. The establishment of a Gauteng Planning house
  - 5.7. The design and deployment of the Gauteng Integrated Infrastructure Master Plan and
  - 5.8. Implementation of the Green Agenda

The MEC noted that this draft plan is now going to be presented to Exco (Premier and the MEC) were it will be ratified and thereafter, form the Performance

Agreement with the Department.
